

Paths Around

1 Achmore

Funding for a new link path for the network of paths in Strome Wood is being developed by the Fernaig Community Trust.

The Trust have promoted the walks with an orientation panel in the car park and associated waymarking throughout.

2 Balmacara

Signage promoting National Trust Scotland (NTS) Paths in Balmacara and Kirkton area – backed up by National Trust leaflet and touch screen display in the visitor centre in Balmacara Square which gives information on access opportunities and other areas of interest.

3 Broadford

Highland Access Project funded a study “Developing a Path Network for Broadford” – developing the former narrow gauge railway to the old marble quarry for walking and cycling. From the Marble Line the historic link to Coire-chat-achan was similarly upgraded and a new footbridge constructed over the River Broadford. Broadford Environmental Group have produced an excellent leaflet promoting these routes. HAP signed up Marble Line; Irishman’s Point Circuit; Old Corry Circuit; Waterloo-Breakish-Ashaig Route.

4 Kiloaxter

Signs and waymarkers promote the Heribusta and Loch Sneosdal circular walks. These can be combined to a larger figure of 8 walk. The Community Council has embarked on developing an information shelter to promote these and other walks in the area.

7 Raasay

Consultancy study – “Signage Plan for Walking & Cycling Routes on Raasay” – oak signage and waymarkers installed by HAP to promote 33kms of coastal, forest and hill trails on the Island. Panels and leaflets planned in the future to back up the signage on the ground. Upgrade works also carried out on Clachan to Osaig route.

5 Kyle

Pladaig Road, Little Badicaul and Murchison’s Monument are all signed routes as part of the NTS paths promoted throughout the Lochalsh area from the visitor centre in Balmacara Square.

8 Portree

The Highland Access Project commissioned a study “Developing a Path Network for Portree”. Scorrybreac path – a new section of path was constructed to complete the 3km circular walk. A new entrance gate was installed for all abilities access. HAP promotion through signage, leaflets and orientation panel – bench also installed at viewpoint to The Storr.
