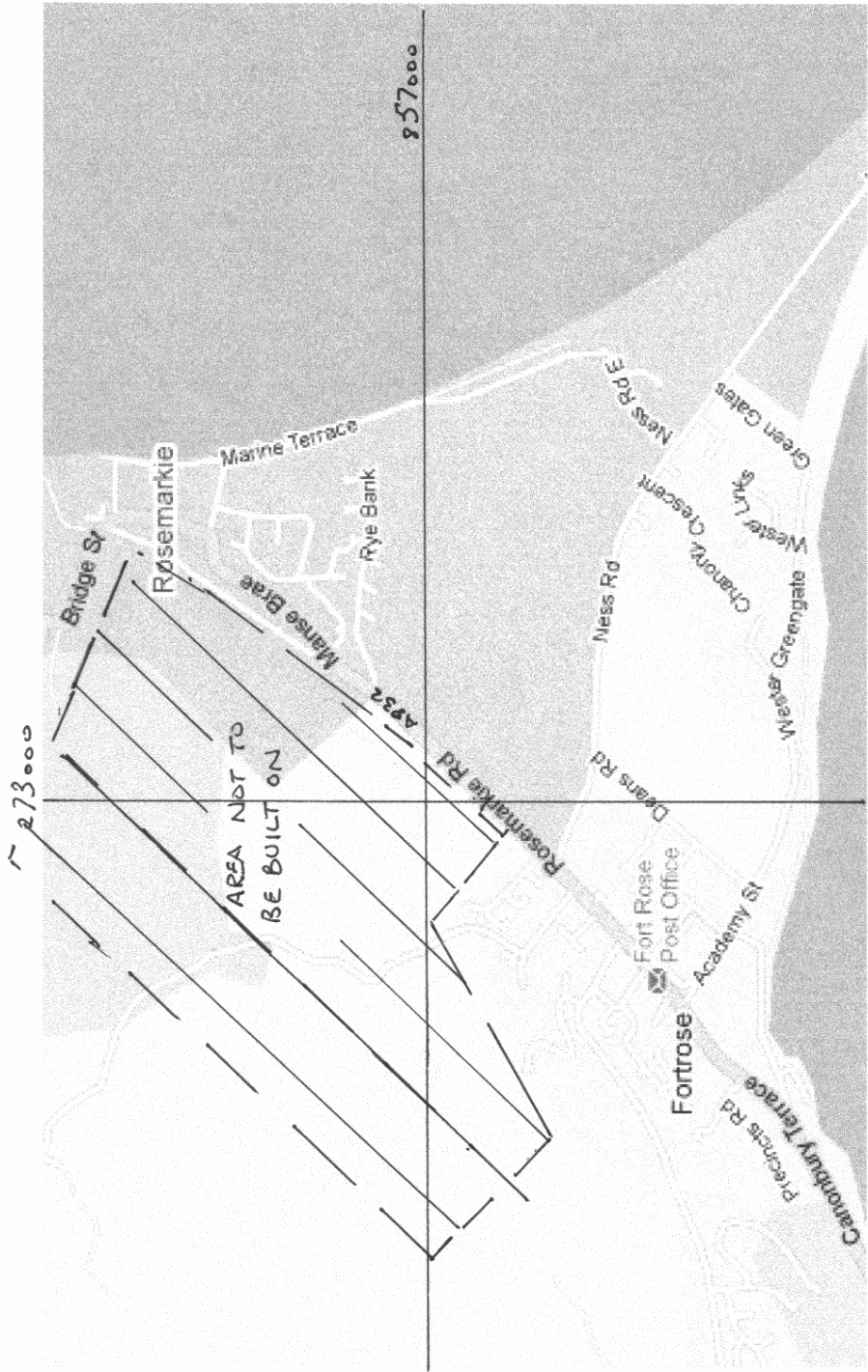


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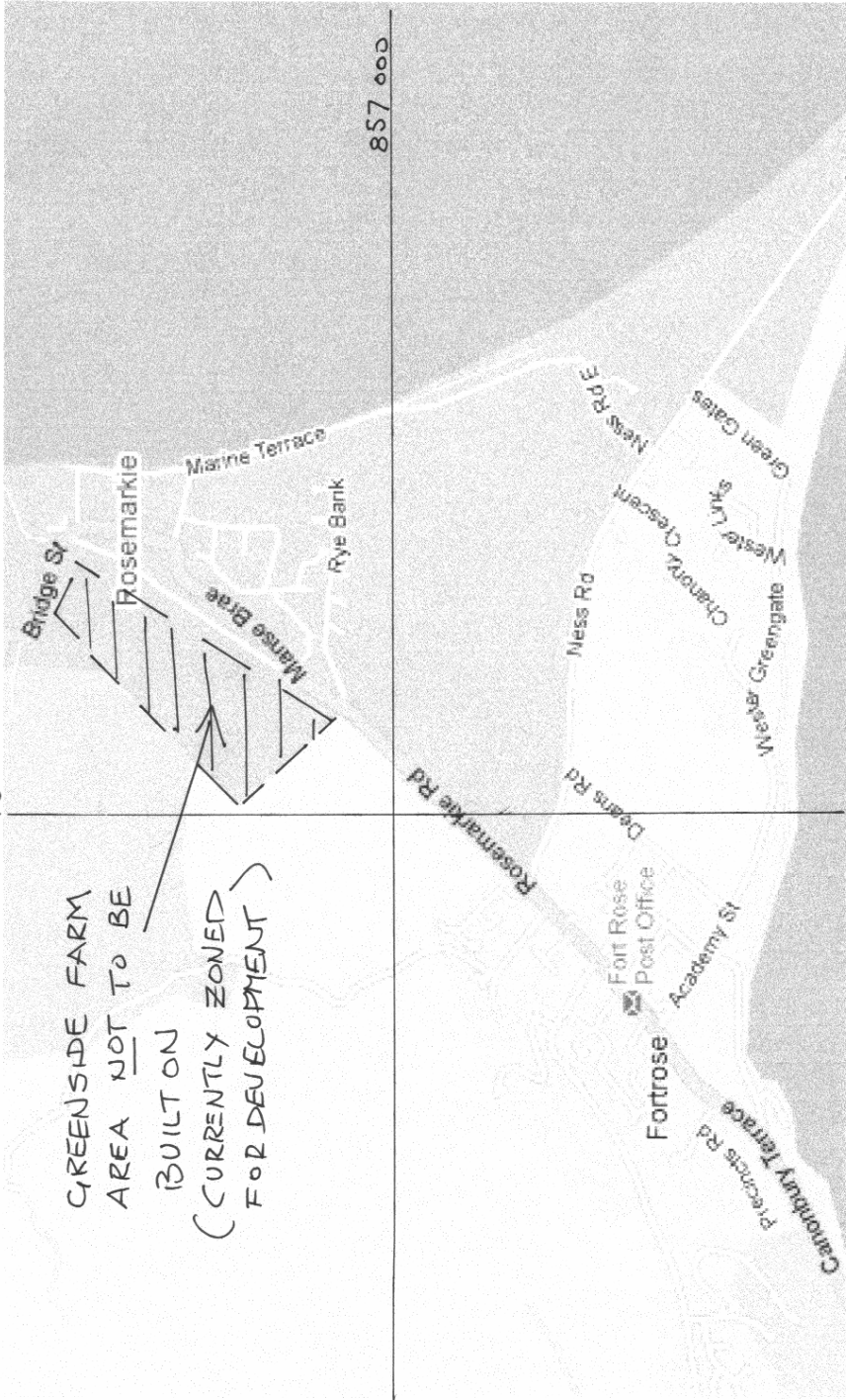

How do the public enjoy the space	Visual pleasure.
What makes the site more special than other areas in the village/town?	<p>The three almost contiguous sites present magnificent vistas to the south from the north and from the north the south.</p> <p>Whether one likes it or not, this is a motor-car based society in the UK, and this is certain to continue for at the very least 200 years</p> <p>The local community and the large numbers of tourists would be deprived of the splendid vistas were the site to be 'developed' for building.</p>

Does the site have attractive or rare features	<p>The sites allow glorious sweeping vista to the coast from inland and from the coast towards the Hill of Fortrose. Moreover, it is the best agricultural land on the Black Isle in the farming, soil science, and soil nutriment senses. (<i>Vide</i> The Macaulay Land Use Research Institute)</p> <p>It seems to us that this should be borne in mind not only in the ,local and national senses, but also for world-wide reasons of food-production.</p> <p>SPECIAL NOTE</p> <p>In the absence of definite and detailed proposals for 'development we are not at this stage completing the extensive information sought on the remainder of the form with its overlapping questions. Suffice it to assert at this stage that the roads system is already approaching saturation - especially obvious in the tourist season.</p> <p>Further, we believe that decisions should not be taken in isolation from the whole community structure bordering on the Inverness Firth and including the city which used to be rather attractive.</p>
