# Supporting statement for submission of **Stratherrick and Foyers Local Place Plan** to The Highland Council

31<sup>st</sup> May 2023 (updated 15<sup>th</sup> August 2023)

### 0. INTRODUCTION

This statement accompanies the submission of Stratherrick and Foyers Local Place Plan to The Highland Council by Stratherrick and Foyers Community Council.

The Local Place Plan covers the Stratherrick and Foyers Community Council area.

The Local Place Plan and this statement have been prepared in accordance with:

- Town and Country Planning (Local Place Plans) (Scotland) Regulations 2021<sup>i</sup>
- <u>Scottish Government Planning Circular 1/2022 Local Place Plans<sup><sup>ii</sup></u>

The Plan covers the Stratherrick and Foyers Community Council area stretching from the south side of Loch Ness up into the Monadhliaith mountains, including the villages and hamlets of Foyers, Boleskine, Inverfarigaig, Torness, Errogie, Gorthleck and Whitebridge. A map of the Community Council area can be seen in the Plan.

The plan should be read in conjunction with our <u>Community Action Plan</u><sup>iv</sup> published in 2022, which contains our aspirations and action priorities for the next 5-10 years. The purpose of the Local Place Plan is to help the community, public bodies, landowners, businesses and funders understand how those aspirations and actions will 'land on the ground', and consider how they can each best support positive change in the area.

The Local Place Plan is based on the vision and action areas contained in the Community Action Plan:

- Vision: Nurture our Environment | Sustain our Economy | Develop our Community
- Action Areas: Community Life | Outdoors, Nature and Heritage | Getting About | Our Homes (the Community Action Plan contains a fifth action area, Organising Ourselves, which is less relevant for the Local Place Plan).

#### 3. REGARD GIVEN TO EXISTING PLANS

In preparing the Local Place Plan, the community had regard to the following plans:

- <u>National Planning Framework 4</u> (NPF4)<sup>v</sup>
- Adopted Inner Moray Firth Local Development Plan (2015)<sup>vi</sup>
- <u>Proposed Inner Moray Firth Local Development Plan</u> (2022)<sup>vii</sup>
- Adopted Highland-wide Local Development Plan (2012) viii
- Stratherrick and Foyers Community Action Plan (2022)<sup>iv</sup>

As explained on page 4 of the Local Place Plan, the Plan reflects national planning policy aims of creating sustainable, liveable and productive places as expressed in NPF4, including Local Living / 20 Minute Neighbourhoods, alongside the community issues and aspirations summarised in the <u>Community Action Plan</u><sup>iv</sup> and the additional community engagement described in section 2 of the Local Place Plan.

#### 4. SUPPORT FOR THE LOCAL PLACE PLAN

The community engagement process used to develop the Local Place Plan, along with the levels of participation, is explained in section 1 of the Plan. It combined the engagement undertaken for the Community Action Plan in 2021 (summarised on <u>this webpage</u><sup>iv</sup>) with additional community engagement for the Local Place Plan in 2022-23.

Two reports explain the two main stages of additional community engagement undertaken specifically for the Local Place Plan:

- 1. <u>Report of village-by-village community engagement events</u><sup>ix</sup> in November 2022.
- 2. <u>Report of consultation on the draft Local Place Plan<sup>x</sup> in March-April 2023</u>.

The Community Council is satisfied that the Local Place Plan provides an accurate and evidencebased view of local residents' views.

### 5. AMENDMENTS TO THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Local Place Plan contains a number of suggestions for the Council to consider as it prepares the forthcoming Highland Local Development Plan. These are contained in the table on pages 46-48 of the Local Place Plan, together with reasons, as required by Scottish Government Circular 1-2022 'Local Place Plans', paragraphs 32-33<sup>xi</sup>.

We trust that the Council will find our suggestions helpful, along with those from other communities, as it develops the Highland Local Development Plan. This is an opportunity to use planning policy and other levers to more effectively tackle issues to communities across the Highlands such as enabling more active travel and public/community transport, affordable housing for working people, and access to services, facilities and opportunities.

We would be happy to discuss our suggestions in more detail, and look forward to hearing how the Council will take account of our suggestions.
