### THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS) (TEMPORARY 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2023

The Highland Council, being satisfied that traffic on certain roads should be restricted because of the likelihood of danger to the public, made the above-named order in terms of Section 14(1)(b) of the Roads Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order was to introduce a 20mph speed limit on roads in 125 settlements across the Highland Council area, including Inverness and other towns and villages throughout Highland. Traffic signs indicate where the speed limit applies. A copy of the Order can also be inspected at Highland Council Service Points across the Highland Council area.

The Order, came into force on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023 and was due to expire on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2025.

The Council sought and has received a direction from the Scottish Ministers, in accordance with Section 15(3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, that the Order shall continue in force for a further period of six months until 31<sup>st</sup> July 2025.
