#### Board title and membership

Report by Head of Policy and Reform, Highland Council

<b>1.</b>	<b>Background</b>
1.1	At the Board meeting in December, members asked that the Chief Officers Group (COG) consider a revised title for the Board (Highland Public Service Partnership Performance Board) to reflect its wider leadership role in public service reform.
1.2	At the COG meeting in January three options were proposed, as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Highland Community Planning Partnership</li><li>• Highland Community Planning Board</li><li>• Collaborate Highland <i>Planning and delivering for Highland together</i></li></ul>
1.3	Board members are asked if any of these are preferred for the Board title.
1.4	Membership of the Board was also to be considered given the wider range of bodies involved in delivering public services. Board members also noted that many other bodies were involved in community planning structures at the thematic and area levels. A separate paper to this meeting identifies five strategic priorities for the Board to consider. Given that form should follow function, once the priorities are finalised it is proposed that membership of the Board is reviewed.

#### **2. Recommendation**

2.1 Board members are asked to consider if any of the options at Paragraph 2.1 for naming the Board are preferred and to note that a review of membership should take place once CPP strategic priorities are finalised.
