Safer Highland Update

Structure

The work on developing the Safer Highland structure under the Chief Officer Group is complete. An update chart has been attached for member information and noting that hate crime group is now included.

Performance

Overall the communities in Highland remain safe. Crime has been reduced by 19% and when crime is reported there is good evidence of catching those responsible.

Nationally there is continued debate about the deployment of Firearms Officers and the stop search tactic. Firearms Officers will not be routinely deployed in the Highlands as they were prior to July 2014. Stop and Search has never been an issue here. There have been no consensual searches of under 12 year olds, which is topical in the media at this time.

Locally progress has been made raising the profile of the Safer Highland Group. There has been coverage on television and in the newspapers, linking crime reduction to the work of the group, not just the Police.
