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		<p><b>The Family Team Structure.</b> Presentation and overview provided by Sam Brogan. Structures are organised around Associated School Groups (ASG's) as this had been found to be the most effective mechanism for provision of services. Reasons for change were outlined. Staffing and organisation also outlined. 		<p><b>The Parenting Framework.</b> An overview of the framework was provided and the use of District Partnerships to bring forward issues at a local level outlined. The report circulated provided details of the framework. It was highlighted that the Voluntary Sector is not involved in Nairn, Badenoch &amp; Strathspey and that there is a gap in the area. This is to be further developed. The Framework provides for interventions and a better range of services being offered.</p>		
5	Adults Services	<p><b>Reshaping Care for Older People Project</b></p> <p>An overview of the RCOP Project was provided by Community Networkers Anne Howe (Badenoch &amp; Strathspey) and Roy Anderson (Nairn). RCOP has access to the Community Initiative Fund which is targeted at enabling initiatives. AH/RA can help and advise on developing project ideas. Successful initiatives outlined included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Aviemore Art Group. This had sparked development of a group at Glebe Court and the two were now linked.</li> <li>• OTAGO Classes – joint Highlife Highland Initiative being piloted in Aviemore and Dingwall</li> <li>• Nairn Friendship Club – 60 + attendees.</li> <li>• B.I.G. Group – excellent example of a successful intergenerational project</li> <li>• BIG Conversations – Initiative currently being promoted.</li> </ul>
