1. Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 This report asks Members to approve the street name of a new development in Alness.

2.2 Members are asked to:

- Approve the name of a new development in Alness as Fulton Court

3. Proposed Street Name

- 3.1 A new street name was requested for a new Highland Council development of 6 properties in Alness off Perrins Road.
- 3.2 Under the scheme of delegation the naming of new buildings and streets within the Council's control falls within the remit of the Ross and Cromarty Committee. The name is required as soon as possible to allow the installation of services
- 3.3 Name proposals put forward were Orchard Place (there was an orchard on the site) or Perrins Court/Place. These suggestions were welcomed but the use of stem names already used locally is not encouraged and the Community Council put forward an alternative suggestion of Fulton Court - Fulton was the name of the family who had lived there for many years. Local Members supported this suggestion. The Committee is therefore requested to approve this name.
