1. Purpose/Executive Summary

- 1.1 This report provides an update of key information in relation to the schools within the Dornoch Associated School Group (ASG), and provides useful updated links to further information in relation to these schools.
- 1.2 The primary schools in this area serve over 200 pupils, with the secondary school serving 206 young people.

School staff information from Staff Census collected Sept 2017. Please note that only certain types of teaching posts are counted here: Normal complement, Long term sick absence replacement, secondment replacement, maternity leave replacement, other replacement, temporary contract, covering a vacancy. Teachers who teach at the school but are centrally employed are excluded.

Pre-school staff information has been taken from the Pre-School Census returned to the Scottish Govt in September 2017.

Core staffing is calculated using the Highland Staffing Model, which takes

account of national agreements for P1 to P3 class sizes. As a result, all primaries in this ASG are staffed according to the model. The Primary Staffing Arrangements are currently being revised and the new Highland Staffing Model will be shared in due course.

In addition to core staffing for each school, a model will be used to provide an appropriate level of ASN cover to each school within the ASG. This model was approved at Adult and Children's Services Committee, 26th September 2012 (Item 9a). Report [ACS-33-12](#).

All the staffing posts indicated in the data have been filled. There is now a PT ASN for the 3-18 school. Previously there was not a PT for ASN in the Dornoch schools. For a new pupil who is expected we are going to use a new approach in order to be working in close partnership with NHS Highland to provide trained staff in school.

This session we are funding additional staffing for the ASG as follows:

- 2.8 FTE ASN teachers
- 9.3 FTE PSA staff equivalent to 255.75 PSA hours
