1. Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 This paper reports on the key points of work and allocations from The Ross & Cromarty Educational Trust for the 2022-2023 financial year.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 Members are asked to:
 - 1. Review and note the content of the report; and
 - 2. delegate authority to Education officers to explore options to improve investment income and report findings back to the Committee.

3. Implications

Awards levels are based on annual investment income. Those in receipt of bursaries have the priority for annual awards for the duration of their course.

3.1 Resource

All work will be managed within budget allocations.

3.2 Legal

Statutory requirements are met as necessary.

3.3 Community (Equality, Poverty, Rural and Island)

There is no identified impact.

3.4 Climate Change / Carbon Clever

There is no identified impact.

3.5 Risk

There are the usual associated risks of trust funds held in investment accounts, where income varies from year to year.

3.6 Gaelic

There is no identified impact.

4. The Ross & Cromarty Educational Trust Scheme

- 4.1 The capital sum of £754,000 is invested in shares held by The Highland Council. The income for year ending April 2023 was £9963. Grants of £9652 were paid out. The income is broadly in line with expectations, given the current economic climate.
- 4.2 Awards were made for a variety of purposes including:

- 4.3 The priority for awards are:
 - 1. Prize funds to schools
 - 2. Bursaries to individuals (with continuing students having priority for the duration of their course)Other grants to support sports, educational travel, visual arts, music, drama and research.
- 4.4 In the last financial year, as in the previous few years, there was insufficient income to make awards in category 3, and there were no applications to this category.

- 4.5 Appendix 1 outlines the prize and bursaries amounts which may be expended, subject to sufficient investment income. It is noted that the income available last year was 58% of the potential maximum awards.
- 4.6 In the light of low income from a significant capital investment, members are asked to give delegated authority to the education service to explore financial options for improving income.
