# **Purpose/Executive Summary**

**Description:** Formation of Aviemore to Carrbridge Non-Motorised User Route/Path

**Ward:** 20 – Badenoch and Strathspey

# Recommendation

Members are asked to note the submission of the PAN and highlight any material issues they wish to be brought to the attention of the applicant before the submission of an application for planning permission.

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 13 May 2024. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 A previous PAN for this development was submitted in June 2022. However, the statutory period for lodging the planning application subsequently expired, necessitating submission of a new PAN.
- 1.4 The submitted information attached includes:
  - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
  - Location Plan
- 1.5 The applicant will hold the first public event on 05 June 2024 at Aviemore Community Centre, with the second event due to take place on 20 June 2024.
- 1.6 The applicant has intimated that the Proposal of Application Notice has been served on the following community councils Aviemore & Vicinity; Boat of Garten; Carrbridge; Dulnain Bridge; Grantown-on-Spey; Kincraig & Vicinity; Nethy Bridge; and Newtonmore, as well as local Elected Members, MPs and MSPs.
- 1.7 The consultation will be publicised and advertised in accordance with the appropriate statutory requirements with adverts placed in the Inverness Courier, Highland News, Strathspey and Badenoch Herald and The Press and Journal at least 7 days in advance of events. Details of all notified parties are contained and appended to the PAN form.
- 1.8 The forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.
- 1.9 Any application of this type and scale of development will be called in by the Cairngorm National Park Authority (CNPA) for determination as it constitutes a Type 1 development -

#### 2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

2.1 The PAN provides notice of the developer's intention to submit a planning application classified as a Major Development. The proposed development is for the formation of Aviemore to Carrbridge Non-Motorised User (NMU) Route/Path.

- 2.2 The development will create a Non-Motorised User route/path for a distance of approximately 10km, linking Aviemore and Carrbridge. It follows the existing road corridors of the B9152, A95 and B9153 to provide a direct link between the two settlements. The development will create a wholly segregated NMU route/path between Aviemore and Carrbridge. Some of the works will include the upgrading of existing infrastructure as well as widening paths to meet the required 3m standard for an NMU route/path. However, most of the work will require the construction of a new route/path.
- 2.3 The proposed scheme has sought to closely follow existing road corridors in order to reduce environmental impacts including incursion into adjacent woodland habitats and potential disturbance to protect any priority species as well as minimise landscape and visual impacts.
- 2.4 The proposed scheme is aligned with the Scottish Government's commitment to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2045 through the provision of a sustainable alternative to the use of Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) powered travel modes on the existing road network between Aviemore and Carrbridge.
- 2.5 It will contribute to all four of the priorities of the Scottish Government's National Transport Strategy 2 (2020). Through the provision of a dedicated off-line route for NMUs, it will reduce inequalities between those with access to motorised vehicles and those without. Through encouraging active travel and, in particular, displacing private car journeys it will reduce GHG emissions, delivering climate action. It offers the opportunity to both communities and visitors to realise health and wellbeing benefits by choosing active travel modes to journey between the two locations. It is also complementary to inclusive economic growth goals, providing opportunities for visitor spend to permeate more widely through enhanced accessibility to more rural locations.

#### 3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The development site is located between Aviemore and Carrbridge within the Cairngorm National Park Authority boundary. The NMU route/path will be a minimum of 1.5m from the trunk road and the railway line that both run to the western boundary of the proposed route. Along the route there are sections of core paths, areas of forestry (including ancient woodland), aspen stands, species rich heath, and protected species.
- 3.2 The closest designated site to the proposed route is the Loch Vaa Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and Special Protection Area (SPA), designated for its breeding Slavonian grebe, Goldeneye and beetle assemblage. The site also hosts capercaillie as such the proposed development may result in disturbance and the loss of habitat. It is also highly likely that the proposed route hosts colonies of wood ant which may also be affected by the proposed development. Protected mammals found in the area include badger, red squirrel, otter, water vole and pine marten.
- 3.4 The site contains a number of watercourses and ponds as such there are areas that are susceptible to both fluvial and pluvial flooding.

# **Location Description (South-to-North):**

• The Aviemore to Carrbridge Non-Motorised User (ACNMU) route starts to the North of Dougal Drive. A priority crossing will be provided to connect with the existing Speyside Way

(Core Path LBS116) to the South of Dougal Drive. The route continues North to Granish Junction and is remote from carriageway route running to the East of the B9152.

- The Existing T-Junction between the B9152, A95 and A9 will be replaced by a proposed roundabout as part of the P11 Dalraddy to Slochd Project. The route will remain on the Eastern side of this newly constructed roundabout. A crossing will take users from the East to the West of the A95, approximately 60 metres North of the roundabout
- Between Granish Junction and Avielochan the route remains adjacent the West of the A95 carriageway
- Due to the close proximity of an existing pond adjacent to the A95 at Avielochan, the route is remote from carriageway at this location
- The route runs to the West of the Highland Main Line Railway (HMR), at the top of the existing A95 road cutting. Between Highland Mainline Railway Underpass and Kinveachy Junction, the route is adjacent to the West of the A95 carriageway
- At Kinveachy Junction the development will continue from the West side of the A95 to the West side of the B9513 via crossing of an access road. The route is remote from the B9153 to retain the line of mature trees which are adjacent to the West of the carriageway. An uncontrolled crossing of the B9153 will be provided to connect with the existing off carriageway NCN7 leading to Boat of Garten. Between Kinveachy Junction and Carrbridge the ACNMU runs on the West side of the B9153.
- The ACNMU route terminates at the Southern extents of Carrbridge. For cyclists traveling North from the ACNMU into Carrbridge, a transition has been provided to allow cyclists to continue on the B9153 carriageway.

#### Formation of Aviemore to Carrbridge Non-Motorised User Route/Path

The formation of this route will involve both the construction of new bituminous surface pathways and the upgrading and/or widening of existing infrastructure to 3 metres wide.
