Report Title: Highland Charities Trust – Allocation of Funds

1. Purpose/Executive Summary

- 1.1 This report sets out the request for funding of £2,000 from the Nairn and Auldearn Poor Fund. The Nairnshire Area Committee has power to allocate these funds
- 1.2 The funding is to be used as a form of Hardship fund to serve the residents of Nairn and Nairnshire

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 Members are asked to:
 - i. To **Agree** to allocate funds from the Nairn and Auldearn Poor Fund to be used as a form of Hardship Fund to serve the people of Nairn and Nairnshire.
 - ii. To **Agree** that officers approach the Citizens Advice Bureau to administer the funds as part of the 'Peoples Pot' currently administered by CAB.

3. Implications

- 3.1 Resource Funding is provided by the Highland Charities Trust budget for 2024/25
- 3.2 Legal There are no legal implications because of this report
- 3.4 Risk There may be demand that may exceed the available budget.
- 3.5 Health and Safety (risks arising from changes to plant, equipment, process, or people) There are no H&S implications because of this report
- 3.6 Gaelic There are no Gaelic implications

4. Impacts

4.1 In Highland, all policies, strategies or service changes are subject to an integrated screening for impact for Equalities, Poverty and Human Rights, Children's Rights and Wellbeing, Climate Change, Islands and Mainland Rural Communities, and Data Protection. Where identified as required, a full impact assessment will be undertaken.

- 4.2 Considering impacts is a core part of the decision-making process and needs to inform the decision-making process. When taking any decision, Members must give due regard to the findings of any assessment.
- 4.3 This is an update report and therefore an impact assessment is not required.

5. Background

- 5.1 Members had requested for officers to look at ways to provide a form of 'Hardship' funding scheme that could be used within Nairn and Nairnshire. The fund is to be used as a discretionary fund to support the residents in financial need through the coldest months of the year.
- 5.2 While the model for administering the payments from the fund are to be confirmed, initial discussion with Citizens Advice Bureau, Nairnshire, have been held with a form of administering support funds already in place with them. The funds allocated would be used as a trial and will review at year end.
- 5.3 Total amount in the Nairn Poor Fund that is available through revenue is £11,834.02 as confirmed by finance.

6. Fund Status

- 6.1 This fund is not a common good fund. It is one of many funds administered by the council which have been bequeathed for public benefit across the Highlands.
- 6.2 The council has decided that those funds which are targeted to benefit areas, can be administered by the relevant area committee. This includes the Nairn and Auldearn Poor Fund.
