1 Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 Due to an administrative error the boundary between Creich and Ardgay & District Community Councils is incorrect. This report proposes a minor realignment to correct the error.

5 Background

- 5.1 Several years ago, the boundaries for Community Councils across Highland were digitised and maps produced which were published on the Highland Council website. The boundaries are also used in some cases to determine the polling station where an elector votes.
- In the case of the boundary between Creich and Ardgay & District Community Councils, which follows the natural boundary formed by the Kyle of Sutherland and River Oykel, the digital boundary drawn on the map contained some errors causing six households and two commercial properties to the south of the Kyle or river being assigned to Creich CC and vice versa. 6 Proposal

6.1 It is proposed to correct the error by realigning the boundary along the Kyle of Sutherland and River Oykel (see Map 2 in Appendix 1). 


